ANCR Benchmark Innovation Leadership Councils

18 working councils (one for each function) create "straw person" model standards based on best available science and community experience.
Participation open to all members based on relevant knowledge and expertise.

ANCR Benchmark
Innovation Leadership
Councils provide model
standards to Benchmark
Advisory Council for
comment, suggested
revision or modification.
Council consists of all ANCR
members.

ANCR Staff curates and consolidates recommendations on model standards and prepares a final draft for full ANCR member deliberation. [This is an administrative and not a deliberative function. Purpose is to prepare for Step 4.]

All ANCR members meet at the National Community Resilience Benchmark Conference

to deliberate curated model standards. Conference achieves through an open, deliberative voting process.
