

## Section 202 *Definitions*

**AISLE ACCESSWAY.** The path of travel from an occupiable point in a building to an aisle is considered to be an aisle accessway. Often called a “row” in everyday language when adjacent to seats and fixtures, an aisle accessway is typically used by small numbers of people prior to converging with other persons at an aisle. An example of aisle accessways is shown in Figure 202-1.

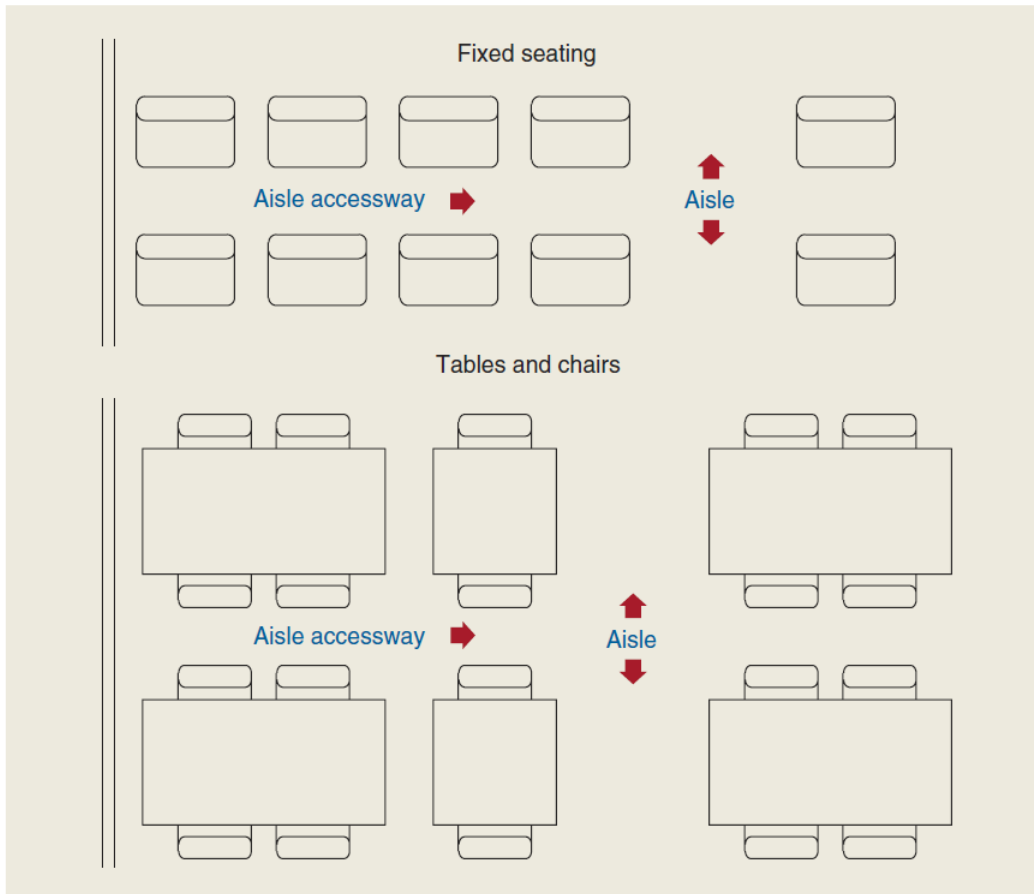
