Less than 2% of buildings are replaced each year. Most of the building stock of 2030 already exists today. After a modern building has received a certificate of occupancy from the local jurisdiction, there are few if any regulations in place to monitor the safety and habitability of the building. Because many existing buildings were constructed without building codes, without the oversight of licensed professionals, and without building permits and construction inspections, these buildings may pose safety threats to occupants and the public. To enhance community resilience, the vulnerability of existing buildings must be addressed.
